CHILD & FAMILY HEALTH Family Coping and Resilience Program

This 2014 traditional grant for \$1,008,626 will provide a training and implementation program to increase access, engagement, around mental health services for NC's military families. CCFH will work to reduce barriers to accessibility of mental health services, and train providers to provide support deployment-related PTSD with a focus on improving outcomes for service members, their children and civilian family members. The Center is one of eight Centers of Excellence within the national initiative to improved access to and the quality of mental health care for veterans, service members and their families. Training NC mental health clinicians in best practices to help services members and their families, training veterans to provide peer support and outreach to service members and their families to promote access to and engagement in quality mental health care, and engagement with community leaders and stakeholders to support and work toward sustainable capacity for therapy and Veteran Peer Support Outreach are the three core components to this grant.
