Triangle Global Health Consortium Mentorship Program 2018-2020

The Mentorship Program works with graduate and undergraduate students from Duke University, North Carolina State University, North Carolina Central University and the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Mentors are recruited as volunteers from the Consortium's 220 member organizations. The pilot program includes mentorship cohorts, online mentorship and informal mentorship opportunities and a jobs board and resume bank online site. This program brings together students, undergraduate and graduate, from departments in public health, nursing and biomedical engineering and industry professionals to build new mentoring relationships. Each mentor participating in the mentorship cohorts will be paired with three mentees and meets with the mentees at set events. The online component will provide the opportunity for mentees to connect with potential mentors, and will host an online "Ask the Experts" in a questions and advice section. The informal mentoring will be hosted at the Global Health Happy Hour on the first Thursday monthly, providing opportunities for networking and face-to-face interactions. The \$51,220 grant provides support over two years for the program at the Triangle Global Health Consortium.
